Report on VANMOHOTSAV – 2024 on 20.7.24 & 25.07.24

The Tree-Planting Festival is unique because it encourages the growth of greenery and raises public awareness of the need to plant an increasing number of trees. Van Mahotsav 2024 tackles problems such as environmental degradation and deforestation. An important occasion in India, Van Mahotsav 2024, attempts to support environmental preservation and afforestation for the earth's ecological balance.

"Trees breathe out for us so that we can breathe in and survive." Van Mahotsav, a week-long celebration devoted to Mother Earth to safeguard the planet's life support system, is one of the most widely observed of them all. Throughout India, tens of thousands of saplings are planted as the monsoon approaches; the festival is essentially a celebration of the birth of new life.
