Report on BARSHAMANGAL & BRIKSHAROPAN- 2025 on 25.7.25 & 26.07.25

"Barshamangal" means "Monsoon Celebrations" or "Monsoon Blessing" in Bengali. It alludes to a celebration that is held to greet the monsoon season in Bangladesh and some regions of India, especially West Bengal and Tripura. "Barsha Utsab" is another name for the celebration. Singing, dancing, poetry readings, and traditional performances are among the cultural events that take place during the day. During monsoon tree plantation is an important activity because it promotes the growth of greenery and increases public awareness of the need to plant more trees. In view of the above fact, NSS unit in collaboration with Maa Sarada Chatrinibas organized **Barshamangal & Briksaropan** utsav to address the issues including deforestation and environmental deterioration. It aims to promote afforestation and environmental conservation for the planet's ecological balance.

Day-1 (25.7.25): There was a tree planting campaign on the college campus, which included Maa Sarada Chatrinibas. On the college campus, Teaching, Non-Teaching staff and students planted roughly fifty Debdaru, Mehogini, and Bokul seedlings. Since native saplings are more likely to grow into full-grown trees and can easily adapt to the local environment, they are typically planted in well-planned tree plantations.
