

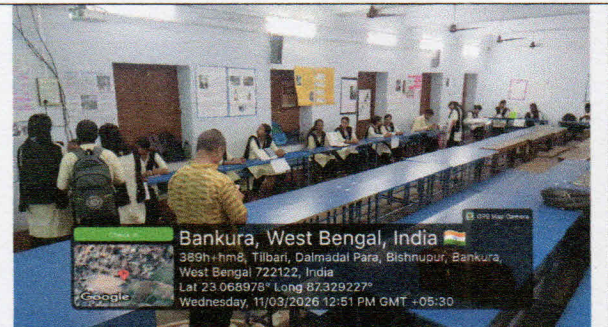

Report on exhibition of the work of famous psychologist on 11.03.2026

Introduction: In order to raise knowledge and comprehension of psychological theories and their practical applications, our institution successfully organised a workshop and exhibition on the works of well-known psychologists. The purpose of the event was to inspire students to learn more about psychology and to value the contributions of distinguished academics.

Organization: Dr. Niranjan Maity, Assistant Professor, Govt. College of Education, Banipur gave an outline of psychology as a field during the workshop's inaugural session. The speaker emphasised the innovative work of notable psychologists including Jean Piaget, who created the theory of cognitive development, B.F. Skinner, who made a substantial contribution to behaviourism, and Sigmund Freud, who is renowned for his theory of psychoanalysis. The lesson was very educational and made difficult psychological ideas easier for the kids to grasp. After the workshop, there was an exhibition where students showcased original works inspired by these psychologists' theories and experiments. Key concepts including the stages of child development, conditioning, and the organization of the human mind were depicted in the exhibition through charts, models, case studies, and interactive displays. The students' effort, inventiveness, and depth of knowledge were all evident in each exhibit.
